Railway Museum

The Living Railway Museum is run by a youth organisation which maintains and preserves old trains (AJECTA). It is housed in a former locomotive hangar in Longueville, near the current railway station. It was first installed in 1971, with AJECTA showcasing rolling stock.

Over time and by dint of acquiring and restoring trains, the warehouse became a museum. It benefitted from restoration work on the rotunda, performed in several stages, and backed by the French Heritage foundation. On 19 June 2008, the back of the railway rotunda in Longueville was inaugurated.

Ever since the first acquisitions of 130 B 476 and 040 TA 137 in 1971 through to the 230 D 116 and 030 T 8157 which arrived in 2009, the Longueville Living Railway Museum has housed the greatest collection of steam locomotives in France



LONGUEVILLE Round trip taking in the Longueville viaduct

After the Longueville viaduct, you will see the brook Les Méances in Chalmaison, the mills in Jutigny, the Voulzie valley and the isolated church in Lourps. The stuff of dream hiking!





Round trip taking in the Longueville viaduct

Leaving Longueville railway station, go down the street to your left and, after turning left then right, continue on Rue des Abîmes. At the end of the road,, take the road on the left, the grassy path on the left for 1km, the road on the left and the D122 on your right through Tachy. Take the little parallel road on your right, turn left, cross the D122 and go up the path opposite. It goes under the bridge and then up towards the wood. Walk along the edge of the wood on your right (for a viewpoint), cross the road and continue for 100m. Go up the path on the left.

2 At the top, go up the path on the left. Take in the views at the top, then turn right, at the bottom (where there are not many blazes) turn right then left and head towards the copse, then on your right towards the crossroads. Continue opposite to cross the railway track. Walk along the edge of the wood, cross the D122 and go down Rue du Perron. Take the street on your right then the path on the left edge. Hop over the brook and follow the path on the left. It hugs the edge of the wood. At the end, take the path on your right to reach the Voulzie.

3 Walk along the river on your right for 1km, take the road on the left, cross the Voulzie and follow the path on your right for 1km. It leads to Jutigny. Take the street on your right and hop across the river at Gouaix mill. Take the path on the left for 500m, the road on the left and cross over the Voulzie at Jutigny mill. Continue to the second crossroads.

4 Take the street to your left, the street on your right, cross the D412 and go up the path opposite. Take the Voulzie aqueduct on your right, then go up the road on the left and, after Lourps church, go down the path on your right. Cross over the D49E, go up the path opposite, then go up the path on the left. It enters the woods.

5 Continue along the road through the hamlet Le Ménillot. At the second crossroads, turn right. This road becomes a path leading to a cross. Turn left to the D61. Follow it on the right to Saint-Denis-lès-Rebais church





The trail markings on this route are installed and maintained by 250 footpath wardens from the Seine-et-Marne departmental hiking committee. (Codérando 77). It is part of a network of 4,500 km of walking and hiking trails in the department.
