

■ The Saint-Jean's gate and the ramparts

These splendid fortified walls were built in the 13th century. The gate's purpose with its two almond-shaped towers, was to ensure the protection of the old road to Paris. On the right, you can find the medieval show area for 'The Legend of the Knights".



■ The Tithe Barn

This typical Provins house with its superb vaulted cellar used to be rented to the merchants of Toulouse when they came to town for the Champagne Fairs. 

Located out of the ramparts, this religious monument was built in the 13th century by the Earl Thibaud IV, on the hill face to his palace, after a vision of Sainte Catherine. It became a hospital in 1749, by order of Louis XV. The archives of the National Department of Patrimony and Historic Monument, and a col-

lege of tourism are kept in this building, which

only opens to the public on rare occasions.



■ The Underground Galleries

With a guide, discover the mysteries of these excavated galleries. Originally a 'fuller's earth' quarry, they have served as a refuge, a cellar and even a meeting place for secret societies... Tickets and Pass



■ The Holy Ghost Cellar


This sumptuous vaulted cellar is the remnant of a general hospital for mendicants and pilgrims. Built in the 12th century, it has been destroyed by fire in the 17th century. Nowadays, it is used as a function room (tourist train stop).



■ The Jouy Gate

Erected in the 12th century, this door owned a pinnacle, a small bell-skeep which permitted to watch out and warn against enemies. This is where you'll find the show "The Eagles of the Ramparts"









DISCOVER THE OTHER MONUMENTS OF DROVINS



■ The Saint-**Ayoul Church**

he church square here was one of the earliest trade and commercial fair areas in Provins. It has been rebuilt many times since the 11th century. The modern sculptor Georges Jeanclos carved its remarkable portal. This church has recently reopened its doors following major restoration work, the most significant since the 16th century: roofs, framework and facings; floors, walls and vaults; new stained glass windows and furnishings; and new lighting to add to its

■ The Sainte-Croix 🕠

Built in the 12th century on the site of an ancient chapel, the church here owes its name to a piece of the True Cross supposedly brought back to Provins by the son-in-law of Saint Louis, Count Thibaud IV. Following a fire in 1305, the church was largely reconstructed in the 16th and 17th cenuries, hence its Renaissance-style



Voulzie Rivers

Woollen cloth was the great speciality of medieval Provins. Renowned for its good quality, the cloth's very dark blue olour (known as "ners" blue) was obtained thanks to the hardness of the River Durteint's water. Further, water was indispensable for many trades: dyer, tanner, butcher.



Provins a medieval fair town

streets of Provins. In the 12th and 13th centuries, the fairs of Provins were the most important in Europe. Cloth merchants from Flanders, Lombardic money-changers, and spice merchants from the orient could be found here. However, at the beginning of the 14th century, the modification of the commercial routes, wars, plagues, the slow disappearance of fairs, as well as the joining of the lands of Brie and Champagne to the kingdom of France

led to the town's decline. In the 19th century, the writers Honoré de Balzac and Jules Vernes, and the painter Moreau le Jeune came to enjoy the romantic views of the ruined ramparts and of Caesar Tower

covered with ivy. Within an hour's reach of Paris, Provins is today an extremely well preserved town of the Middle Ages: 58 monuments included in France's National Inventory of Historical
